Administrative/Biographical History:

Christian Heurich (1842-1945), was born in Haina, Germany, and emigrated to Baltimore in 1866 to join his married sister. Later, he traveled to Chicago to work in a brewery and to Kansas, returning to Baltimore in 1868. Heurich (pronounced *Hi-Rick*) worked for breweries there until 1872 when he and partner Paul Ritter leased Schnell's brewery and tavern on 20th Street, N.W., between M and N Street, in Washington, D.C. Within a year, he bought out his partner's interest and married Schnell's widow Amelia. In 1876, he purchased the brewery buildings and two additional lots. The enlarged brewery covered six lots by 1883 and continued to prosper in spite of a fire that year. Amelia died of pneumonia in 1884. The couple had no children.

Christian Heurich remarried in 1887 to Mathilde Daetz, the German-born sister of the brewery's secretary-treasurer. Instead of living in the brewery complex, they resided just behind it in a house on 19th Street, N.W. The business was incorporated in 1890 as the Christian Heurich Brewing Company. For the second time, the brewery caught fire in 1893 while the Heurichs were building their new house on New Hampshire Avenue. The house was completed in 1894. They had only lived in it a few months when Mathilde Heurich died on January 20, 1895.

In the fall of 1895, Christian Heurich opened a fireproof brewery in the Foggy Bottom area of Washington (now the location of the Kennedy Center). He married Amelia Keyser, the niece of his first wife, in 1899. Their first child, Christian Heurich, Jr., was born in 1901. Their daughter Anna Marguerite came in 1903 but died less than a year later. Anita followed in 1905 and Karla in 1907. The brewery continued to grow and Christian Heurich continued to buy bought real estate with the profits.

Heurich beer with various labels won many awards in Europe and the U.S. Prohibition in 1918 forced the brewery to close, but it continued to produce ice. The brewery resumed operation in 1933 with the repeal of prohibition. Ice production ended in 1940.

The Heurich family went to Europe almost every summer, but when they remained in Washington, they lived at their farm Bellevue in Hyattsville, Maryland. Christian Heurich bred prize cattle there.

Christian Heurich, Jr., married Consuelo Young in 1925 and had three daughters, Consuelo Corinne, Carol and Constance. In 1951, he married Beverly Jones and they had two sons: Christian III and Gary. Anita married Charles E. Eckles in 1928 and they had three children: Stanley, Geoffrey, and Amelia. Karla married Lt. Charles B. King in 1931.

Their children were Jan, Charles Jr., and Donald. Lt. King was killed in France shortly after D-Day in 1944. Karla married Brig. Gen. Eugene L. Harrison in 1946.

The brewery continued operating under Christian Heurich during the 1930s and into the 1940s, even though he was over 90 years old. He worked until nine days before his death on March 7, 1945, at 102. Mrs. Amelia Heurich bequeathed the house to the Columbia Historical Society (now the Historical Society of Washington, D.C.) before her death on January 24, 1956. In 2003, the Historical Society moved from the building, which was subsequently purchased by the Heurich House Foundation and reopened to the public as the Heurich House Museum.

The Christian Heurich Brewing Company continued to operate until 1956, but the company was not dissolved until 1960. The federal government bought the brewery property in 1961 for the Kennedy Center and the approaches to the Theodore Roosevelt Bridge. That same year, 650 sticks of dynamite failed to destroy the ice house completely. A crane and wrecking ball were needed to finish the job. In 1962, the razing of the main building was equally difficult.

Christian Heurich, Jr., died in 1979. His daughter Carol Hoover predeceased him in 1966. Charles E. Eckles died in 1985, his wife Anita in 1986. Although born years after his grandfather's brewery closed, Gary Heurich began the Olde Heurich Brewery in 1985.

Scope and Content:

The Christian Heurich Family Research Collection, 1844-2001, documents the history of a prominent D.C. business, family, and mansion from the Victorian era through the twentieth century.

This collection is a combination of original material gifted by the Heurich family to the Historical Society through multiple accessions; photocopies and copy prints/negatives of original material solicited by the Society and returned to family members; and objects and correspondence donated by non-family members. In addition, in order to better prepare docents to lead tours of the Heurich house, in the 1970s and 1980s the Historical Society commissioned copy projects of family material and conducted extensive research about the house and the family, the latter of which was produced largely by students from the George Washington University's Museum Studies Program. This material, sometimes referred to as the House Research Collection (HRC), forms the bulk of Series III. This finding aid addresses manuscript material, photographs, and objects.

System of Arrangement:

SERIES I: HEURICH BREWERY RECORDS, 1873-1956, consist of account books; correspondence; brewery physical plant and outbuilding blueprints; advertisements; clippings; and photographs; this is primarily original material. Also, the included correspondence provides evidence of the company's record on hiring African Americans and changes in brewing equipment. A subseries of publications relates to brewery history, prohibition and temperance, brewing equipment, and unionism.

SERIES II: HEURICH FAMILY PAPERS, 1844-2000 (bulk 1866-2000), consists of subseries on genealogy and autobiography; personal papers of Christian, Amelia, Karla, and Gary Heurich; photographs of travel and family members including Amelia Schnell Heurich, Mathilde Daetz Heurich, and Donna Keyser; Bellevue Farm property records, photographs, and clippings; and publications related to the family and family recipes. This series also contains audiotapes, phonograph recordings and videotapes about the Heurich family and house. This series comprises photocopies, copywork and original material.

SERIES III: HEURICH HOUSE, 1903-1991, consists of photographs; biographical material about and correspondence concerning the house's architect, John Granville Meyers; specifications; building permits; drawings; designs by August Grass and the Huber Brothers; floor plans; furnishing inventories; appraisals; and garden and outbuilding records and photographs. This series also includes oral histories with Andrew Bell, Deborah Currier, Karla Heurich Harrison, Charles Jacobsen, Paul Muir, and Alberta Victoria Young. Secondary sources in this series feature house tour guides; studies about the house and its servants, technology, specific rooms in the house, historical fireproofing techniques, and architect's specifications; and technical and mechanical systems information. The bulk of this material is from the House Research Collection.

Immediate Source of Acquisition: The collection was created through many accessions, including donations by members of the Christian Heurich family (including Gary Heurich, 1980.099); by various members of the public and the Historical Society of Washington, D.C. and its predecessor, the Columbia Historical Society; and through research conducted on behalf of the Columbia Historical Society.

Extent: 9.1 cubic feet
